The Diet Debate

How to choose the right food for your pet.

Lets face it we are all crazy about our pets and want to do what is best for them in every aspect. We feel that choosing the right food and or foods for your pet is probably the most important decision that you will make for their long-term health. There are many pet food options available to the pet caregiver: dry, canned, homecooked and raw. There are also mountains of brands to choose from. So how do you make that decision? When choosing a dry food we feel that:

1) It is important to be aware of the integrity of the company. What is their mission statement? For example, Natura (Innova, California Natural, Evo) strives to be the healthiest pet food in the world! Solid Gold uses only premium quality natural ingredients (e.g., free-range bison, wild salmon, apples, carrots, garlic) chosen for their beneficial, healthenhancing characteristics.

2) It must contain QUALITY meat fit for human consumption (hormone and antibiotic free meat is ideal) as the first and second ingredients. Ann Martin in her eye-opening book Foods Pets Die For has shown that some pet food companies feel that it is all right to use diseased and cancerous meat, road kill and euthanized pets in their food. That is why it is so important to be aware of the integrity of the company you choose!

3) It should not contain harsh chemical preservatives (BHA, BHT, Ethoxyguin), additives and flavour enhancers such as sugar!

4) The food choice should be species appropriate. Cats are carnivores. This means that they survive best on meat. Most dry cat food

> formulations are not species appropriate as they are made up of mostly grain products and corn. The inability to utilise carbohy- drates properly (plus other undesirables) can lead to diabetes, kidney and urinary dysfunction. These ailments have been on the rise since the creation of dry food.

Dogs are omnivores which means that they thrive on foods such as meat, grasses, berries and seeds. Although most dogs can tolerate more

grains than cats they too are eating diets with far too many grain products for their digestive system to handle (more stool!)

5) It should be made up of nutrient-dense foods such as meat, vegetables, fruit, herbs and not of fillers (corn, wheat, soy, brewers rice, peanut hulls)! In my opinion some of the dry food formulas available to the pet caregiver are nothing more than "The Super Size Me Diets" with a multivitamin added to it. Gregory Tilford and Mary Wulf-Tilford write in

carnivores probably live their lives malnourished". Further, we are seeing that many health problems such as diabetes, allergies, obesity, eczema, ear infections, hot spots and some forms of cancer do stem from a poor diet in some way. (cont. on next page)

6) It is important to be aware that beneficial, good quality fats that are essential for good health are destroyed in the cooking process. Cooked, generic oils in dry foods may turn into trans fats that are actually harmful to your pet! Look for a dry food that uses freeze-dried oil such as Nature's Variety Prarie brand or a company that sprays the cold pressed oil on after it is cooled!

7) You should be able to understand what each ingredient means e.g.,

Brewers rice is an inexpensive by-product of the milling industry and has virtually no nutritional value. The same goes with corn gluten meal. Propylene glycol is a chemical added to some chewy foods to keep them moist.

(Read "Nasty Substances...' on the right for a list of items to avoid in dry pet foods)

If one food does not work for your pet then try another one, a lot of customers find it beneficial to vary the food from month to month to ensure the pet's interest and a variety of nutrients. You should notice that your pet has less stool if they are absorbing the food well, little or no pet odour, little or no tooth plaque, a nice shiny coat, healthy skin, and they should have lots of energy (not the nervous kind). These are just a few of the things that can help your pet's food choice be more informed. For more information on our products, see our website. Also, the

NASTY SUBSTANCES TO WATCH OUT FOR IN PET FOOD:

-Animal Fat: rendered or extracted fat. Restaurant grease has

become a major component of feed-grade animal fat. It is stabilized with powerful antioxidants to retard spoilage, and then sprayed directly onto extruded kibble to increase palatability.

Mmmm...Rendering, as defined by Webster's Dictionary, is "to process as for industrial use: to render livestock carcasses and to extract oil from fat, blubber, etc, by melting."

•Artificial Colouring: used in pet foods, treats, and rawhide toys. Can be harmful, toxic, and definitely has NO nutritional value. Known allergic reactions in humans to: FD&C Red and Yellow no. 5 & 7 dyes. Do our pets care about the colour of their food?

BHA & BHT: synthetic chemical preservatives that may be potentially toxic to kidneys and have been banned for use in human products. Why use them in pet food?

Brewers Rice: the dried extracted residue of barley malt and rice products reulting from the manufacture of wort or beer.

By-Products: non-rendered, clean parts, other than MEAT, derived from slaughtered animals, produced in the course of making a primary food ingredient. It includes, but is not limited to, lungs, spleen, kidneys, brain, livers, blood, bone, partially defatted low temperature fatty tissue, stomachs, intestines freed of their contents. It does not include hair, horns, teeth, and hoofs, except in such amounts as might occur unavoidably in good processing practices. By-product = NO measurable amount of meat/skeletal muscle. Where's the meat? And where's the assurance that they are practicing "good processing"?

•**Corn Gluten meal:** the dried residue from corn after the removal of the larger part of the starch and germ, and the separation of the bran...Where's the nutrition?

•**Corn Syrup:** used as a humectant, which gives food a dampness and flexibility. It is pure processed (ie. SUGAR), which is difficult to digest for our pets, and potentially addictive.

•**Digest:** an animal feed-grade ingredient that must be made soluble with the use of prolonged heat and moisture, or chemicals and enzymes (eg. Poultry feet= "Poultry Digest").

•**Dried Egg Product:** ingredients listed as product may include an unspecified part of the product. Egg product may include eggshells, and may also not include any egg whites. What is the point?

•**Dry Blood Meal:** a rendered product and inexpensive source of animal protein. Why not feed your pets REAL meat, vegetables, and bones?

Ethoxyquin: a powerful synthetic chemical preservative known to be highly carcinogenic. It was originally used as an insecticide and pesticide, as well as a rubber stabilizer. Remember that preservatives extend the shelf life of artificial petfood for months.

•**Gluten:** the sticky substance in wheat or corn starches that gives the starch its tough elastic quality, helping to hold together the pulverized composite of animal feed-grade ingredients (and create KIBBLE!)

•**Meal:** a ground or pulverized composite of rendered animal feed-grade ingredients. Still on the fence here.

·**MSG:** (Mono Sodium Glutamate) a flavour enhancer used to disguise inferior food quality. Known to cause potential brain and eye damage, and allergic reactions in humans.

•**Propyl Gallate:** a synthetic chemical preservative linked to liver damage.

Propylene Glycol: a synthetic chemical preservative and flavour enhancer linked to kidney damage. Also used as a less-toxic version of the sweet-tasting chemical found in anti-freeze and brake fluid solvents.

Sodium Nitrate and Nitrite: synthetic chemical preservatives and colour enhancers both known to be carcinogenic.

- * active, live probiotics and prebiotics to optimise the microbial balance of the gut which improves health, resistance to disease and fecal odour

- * Natura uses as slow cooking process to preserve the nutrients and phytochemicals in the raw ingredients but kills off any potential harmful bacteria.





THE MOST MOST BENEFICIAL THING ABOUT A RAW FOOD DIET...

What do you feel is the most important benefit of feeding a raw diet to our animal companions? I feel that the most important benefit of feeding a raw, fresh food diet is how easy it is for our dogs and cats to digest (beneficial for ferrets as well). In her book Holistic Guide for a Healthy Dog, Wendy Volhard speaks of a study done in Sweden comparing the digestion times of various types of dog foods. This study reports that raw food passes through the stomach into the intestinal tract in 4 and a half hours, semi-moist food takes 9 hours and dry food can take up to 16 hours to break down and become nourishment for the body. The speedy digestion of raw food is due in large part to the fact that the raw food naturally contains enzymes and other nutrients that speed up this process. If there are not enough digestive enzymes present in the food says Wendy Volhard, then the body " gathers enzymes from the heart, the liver, the kidneys and other parts of the body to be transported to the stomach". She calls this process enzyme robbing. Author Kymythy Schultze agrees that the body has a limited supply of its own enzymes as they are meant to be supplied in the food and when the pancreas gets called on too often it sends white blood cells to the digestive system to aid in digestion:

"But when the leukocytes use their enzymatic activity to aid digestion, they are less able to destroy bacteria and foreign invaders in the body. This impairs the immune system".

A second factor contributing to an efficient digestive system is the quality and type of ingredients being fed. There are many common pet food ingredients that are not easy for our canine and feline companions to digest such as meat by-products (see last page for a definition), peas, corn, wheat brewers rice, and soy. Gregory Tilford confirms that if the body cannot digest poor quality protein such as meat by-products the body will treat it as waste rather than food. Now you have a whole other group of problems that may arise such as skin conditions, colitis, arthritis, immune system dysfunction and kidney failure.

The digestive system of our feline and canines has not significantly changed over millions of years, it is still designed to thrive on raw meat. If you are not able to feed a raw diet it is important to add some fresh veggies and fruit (in moderation) to their diet, how about a raw bone once a week? They will love you forever for that one. Many people add a supplement such as Pet Essentials for dogs/cats to their dry food to provide any nutrients lost in the cooking process such as enzymes, greens, essential fatty acids and phyto nutrients. It is important to make informed decisions for our animal buddies as they rely on us to make the best decisions for them and their health.
